

Summer Nights 2013...We're Back!

"Keep Calm and Carry On"...It was oddly fitting that the Weed and Seed Staff T-shirts this year promote just that. Opening Night at Centennial Park brought high winds, heavy rain and even hail, but everyone kept calm and we carried on. The crowd of approximately 200 adults and children enjoyed a block party. Charlie Brown's Notorious Groove had the crowds dancing in the streets.

Summer Nights is a unique summer park program held at Centennial Park in the west ward of Easton. It is managed by Easton Weed and Seed and is a partnership involving the City of Easton, The Family YMCA of Easton Phillipsburg and Vicinity, Easton Area Community Center, Family Connections, Easton Area School District and many local organizations. Summer Nights enriches the west ward community by providing FREE recreation, education, social, and life skills programs for children and their families. Summer Nights consists of several components. Structured activities led by community partners, and a meal provided by Sodexo and the Easton Area Community Center.

This year during Summer Nights we are committed to assuring a healthy environment at the park beginning with adding numerous NO SMOKING signs around the perimeter of the fence. Those who chose to smoke will be asked to move across the street away from the park perimeter. Another healthy addition is that water replaces last year's lemonade/iced tea and families are being encouraged to bring reusable water bottles to cut down waste (paper cups).

The newest addition to this summer's program is a planned curriculum prepared by the Fruition Coalition addressing PA Academic Standards (K-8), Paxinosa CHIEF Values, The Search Institutes Family Asset Framework (Safe Communities) and the Weed and Seed Core Values. Each evening Donne Ruggiero (staff) will lead a curriculum based activity. Some of the activities scheduled are: Brushing Up on Respect, Body Language, Our Constitution: Rights and Responsibilities, CHIEF Bingo, Our Neighborhood, My Favorite Places in the West Ward, Promoting Our Community, Our Park through a Child's Eyes, My Special Gifts, My Hero Trading Cards, Dear Mayor, Our Community Assets, Responding to "isms", The Friendship Game, Who Am I?, Wall of Intolerance, Blanket of Friendship, Stand Up, Exercising Our Right to Vote, Helping Myself Helping Others, When I Grow Up, Put Up's, Philosopher's Stone, Creating a Community, Community of the Future, Paper Plate portraits, What I Really Want, I am a Leader, and a Chain of Hope.

Social Security Column

My Social Security is your online account that provides you quick access to your personal Social Security information.

For people who already receive Social Security or SSI benefits, the *my Social Security* service is even better this year. You can now sign into your account to view, save, and print a benefit verification letter, check your benefit payment information, and even change your address and phone number in our records. You also can start or change your direct deposit information.

We recommend you create a *my Social Security* account so you can always have your Social Security information at your fingertips. Just visit www.socialsecurity.gov/myaccount.

You can use our computers for Social Security business only. The Social Security office at 134 S 4 Street, Easton PA has two Self Help computers for use by the public to reach our website.

Did you know that Easton has a computer center available for anyone to use for free?

The Neston Heights Neighborhood Networks Center, located next to the Boys & Girls Club on the Southside of Easton has 12 computers that run both MAC and Windows Operating Systems. These computers have Microsoft Office 2010, WinWay resume writing software, and Mavis Bacon Typing software. The computers and programs are free for you to use (a nominal fee charged for printing).

During our Open Lab hours, you may use the computers to job search, write your resume, take an online course, email, study, do research, etc. Would you like to learn to use a computer? He and his office staff can help you with financial assistance for higher education, unemployment compensation, state income tax questions, prescription-drug assistance for senior citizens, the Children's Health Insurance Program and more.

If you're planning a summer vacation, why not stay in Pennsylvania? Freeman's office can offer you information about Pennsylvania tourism, its state forests and camping sites, as well as helpful tips about how to prevent and treat Lyme disease.

Using the form, you can ask for free brochures, state maps, a voter registration form, an absentee ballot application and other helpful booklets.

Code of Conduct Summer Nights 2013

Child Code of Conduct

I pledge to be responsible for my words and actions during Summer Nights at Centennial Park. I will adhere to the following code of conduct:

I will not engage in unsportsmanlike conduct or behavior.

I will not engage in any behavior which would endanger the health, safety, or well being of anyone. Fighting will not be tolerated, neither verbally nor physically. You will be removed from the park for any instances of fighting.

I will not use drugs or alcohol.

I will cooperate with the Summer Nights staff to clean up the park at the end of the evening

I will not use of profanity, nor engage in verbal or physical threats.

I agree that if I fail to conform to this Code of Conduct while attending or participating in Summer Nights at Centennial Park, I will be subject to disciplinary action, including but not limited to removal from the park/program and intervention by Easton Police Officers.

Parental Code of Conduct

As a Parent/Guardian, I am aware and accept that Weed and Seed will conduct the Summer Nights program with the highest regard for my child's safety and enjoyment and I agree not to hold the City of Easton responsible for any unforeseen injury that may result while my child is participating in the Summer Nights program. I understand that I am responsible for my child at all times (even if not present at the park). The Weed and Seed Summer Nights program strongly suggests that parents remain with their child/children during Summer Nights programming. Parents/guardians acknowledge their responsibility for:

- Accompanying my child to Summer Nights. Weed and Seed staff are not acting "in loco parentis"/nor are they "babysitters". Weed and Seed staff are never permitted to transport participants.
- Supporting my child during programming by conducting myself in a manner that is worthy of my leadership position as a parent/guardian.
- Encouraging good sportsmanship by demonstrating positive support for all.
- Refraining from the use of foul or abusive language and/or gestures.
- Refraining from the use of any kind of cigarettes, alcohol or drugs while inside Centennial Park.
- Cooperating with the Summer Nights staff to clean up the park at the end of the evening.
- Refer to the proper authority (Easton Police) for dealing with problems/concerns that may arise during programming.

Failure to adhere to the rules and requests outlined within this Parental Code of Conduct agreement will result in follow-up actions taken against parent/guardians and/or participants by the Easton Police.
